Program Objectives:



75% (68,630) of overdose deaths in 2020 were due to Opioid use.

Traces of fentanyl were found in 56% of these cases.



Inform how misuse can lead to addiction, fentanyl/heroin use, overdose, and death.

Recognize opioid overdose symptoms, basics of opioid reversal drug Naloxone and the importance of calling 911 to get help for those in need.

- Understand the disease of addiction and how it impacts the individual and their loved ones.
- Find alternatives to using substances in dealing with life's stresses.

Learn ways to ask for help and find available resources.

Why are youth more susceptible to substance use disorder?

Youth have more neuroplasticity, therefore, when the brain is introduced to a drug repeatedly, it becomes habitual and the brain considers it to be a natural occurrence, feeding the addiction.
